Chairman Ken Svoboda welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 9:05AM.

Kathy McKillip, NIZC Executive Director, then took the Commission roll call at 9:05AM.

Approval of the Agenda

Chairman Svoboda asked for approval of the agenda as distributed. *Motion made by Commissioner Melbye and 2nd by Commissioner Grotrian to approve the agenda as distributed. Motion approved by consent.*

To Date: The NIZC Committee structure with community member input has been strong.

Four Key Committee's: Infrastructure & Planning, Transportation & Logistics, Economic Development & Marketing, Tourism, Environmental & Recreation.

Issues of Interest:

1. Tax Increment Financing for Counties in collaboration and support from cities.
2. Conservation Overlay District & protection for Exit 426.
3. Economic Development Tax Incentive package for development for key interchanges; Ashland-Greenwood, and Gretna
4. Funding for an initial regional comprehensive plan for the I-80 corridor.
5. Funding request for a two-year continuation of the Nebraska Innovation Zone Commission
6. Funding request for support towards the Environmental Carrying Capacity Study – Phase II
7. Regional partnerships for an Infrastructure Development incentive package.
8. Transferable State Sales Tax Credit for donated Conservation Easements.

The Commission continues to develop a Community Guidebook for Planning, to have available to communities within the Corridor, to better assist with planning for regional growth and development.

Key Issues from Visioning Session:

1. Economic Development Financing tools (Combine #'s 1, 3 & 8 from above into one piece).
2. Conservation Overlay District
3. Funding for an initial comprehensive plan for the I-80 Corridor, including an environmental protection component
4. Funding request for a 2-year continuation of the Nebraska Innovation Zone Commission
5. Transferable State Sales Tax Credit for Donated Conservation Easements.
6. Transfer of Development Rights.

Single most important issue;

“To secure funding for the creation of a regional comprehensive plan”.

Key Areas: Future land use, Environmental protection, Infrastructure development and current inventory, demographic trends, public input/opinion/participation, and implementation and recommendations.

Concerns: Funding, plan could easily cost \$500,000, county/community buy-in with funding and social capital support, budget issues, commitment from higher education institutions and participation in process

Suggestions for 2007:

1. Maintain NIZC Committee's as needed.
2. Create an information sheet for Senator's regarding NIZC's areas of concern/interest
3. Annual Report due in February, 2007
4. Continue working with the private sector for outside resources, in-kind donations and funding opportunities
